
The education sector's "Fair Dealing" content usage guidelines are a roadmap for systematic, uncompensated use of published content that is harming the market for innovative new content, licensing and digital services.

The guidelines promote:



- Copying 10% or a whole chapter of a book for free
- Copying entire articles from newspapers & periodicals for free
- Selling copied collections to cover "institutional overhead"
