What is the Purpose of the Photocopying Survey?

The data collected during the survey will help us to fairly distribute royalties to creators and publishers whose works are used in your school.

- Works by creators and publishers are copied and used as teaching tools all over Canada.
- Whether it's a chapter from a chemistry textbook or a great short story, these materials have a huge impact on students.
- Access Copyright wants to ensure creators and publishers are compensated for the use of their work.

**If we don't know what gets copied, we do not know who to pay.
Because paying the creator matters.**

Your School's Access Copyright Licence

- Your licence gives access to millions of published works to spark and nurture classroom learning.
- It also ensures that the creators and publishers of the works used are fairly paid so that they can continue creating content for the classroom.
- Along with outlining what you can copy under the licence, it includes a provision to conduct a copying survey in randomly selected schools annually.



Our school's Access Copyright licence gives educators and staff members access to millions of published works to inspire and spark classroom learning.

Thanks to information collected during copying surveys from randomly selected elementary and secondary schools, Access Copyright distributes the royalties that our school pays to the specific creators and publishers whose works have been reported copied in K-12 schools.

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UNDER OUR SCHOOL'S LICENCE, YOU CAN:

Copy up to 10% of a published work in Access Copyright's repertoire, or any of the following:

- One chapter, as long as it isn't more than 20% of the entire book;
- A complete newspaper article or page;
- A single short story, play, article, poem or essay from a work that contains other works such as an anthology;
- An entry from a reference work like a dictionary; or
- A reproduction of an artistic work from a work that contains other works.

PLEASE ENSURE:

- Whenever possible, that the source and author's name are included on at least one page of the copy; and
- That you limit the number of copies to one per student, two for the teacher and a reasonable amount required for administrative purposes, to contact parents or to allow on-site consultation or loan at a library.

PLEASE DO NOT:

- Make course packs
- Intentionally split copying portions to exceed the licence limits
- Sell copies or use them for merchandising, advertising or commercial purposes
- Alter or distort the work

About the Photocopying Survey

- The survey process is quick and simple.
- The survey will be carried out over a 10-day period in randomly selected elementary and secondary schools across British Columbia.
- Each school will designate a survey coordinator to oversee and facilitate the survey.
- All instructions and necessary materials will be provided to selected schools by Access Copyright.
- During the survey period, teachers are required to make a record each time they make a paper copy from a paper or digital source.

Information for Survey Coordinator

- We will contact you before the survey period to arrange for a short training phone call or webinar.
- Before the survey begins, you will be sent a package containing all the materials you will need:
 - Survey posters
 - Survey collection boxes
 - Stickers for teachers to fill out
 - Shipping waybill and envelope

During your school's participation in the survey, you play an important role each time you make a paper copy from a paper or digital source.

By recording what you have copied, you help us at Access Copyright make sure we can pay the specific creators and publishers whose works spark and nurture your students' imagination and curiosity.
